FROM THE BISHOP



With very little fanfare and publicity, "A Case for Love," a film based on the writings and message of Presiding Bishop Michael Curry, was released for only one day and two showings this past Tuesday. It was also available in only select theaters: in Alaska, those theaters were limited to Fairbanks and Anchorage.

It is pretty certain that very few people saw the film. I was happy to see it at the Regal Cinema in Fairbanks with my son, Jack, and his

friend, Charity. I hope that the film will eventually be available in other

formats or for streaming. In documentary and autobiographical style, the film tells stories of several people and families who despite extraordinary challenges, hardships, loss, and grief found hope and their lives transformed by some expression of unselfish love either by another person or through their own experience of reaching out in care for someone else.

Throughout the film, the key question is asked of many individuals: "what is love?"

The film is worth watching if for no other reason than Bishop Curry's charge at the conclusion of the film. **The Presiding Bishops invites us to spend the next 30 days** (and I would suggest any 30 days) exploring and practicing unselfish love, the kind of love we see lived out in Jesus, the kind of love that can transform the world.

At one point in the film, Curry reminds us all that in the face of all the challenges we confront in this world, no one can do it all. But all of us can do something. When it comes to unselfish love, no gesture is too small to be transformative.

So I am inviting the Diocese of Alaska to take on the challenge of unselfish love. And I am going further to invite us to make this not a 30-day project, but a full Lenten discipline. Practice kindness. Make the effort to listen to others. Seek to understand more than to be understood. Help when you can help. Smile when you can smile. Call someone who could use a call. Resist the snakey comment. Think before you respond. Pray before you react. And walk in love as Christ loved us and gave himself for us an offering and sacrifice to God.

St. Augustine's...On Pilgrimage



In late September, Judy Mullikin and I flew to Madrid and along with two friends from Nome, walked on the Camino del Norte (along the northern coast of Spain) for six weeks. It was a FABULOUS trip in so many ways; it's hard to know where to start.

There are Caminos all over Spain and other countries in Europe too.

The ones in Spain lead pilgrims to the *Catedral de Santiago de Compostela*, a breathtakingly beautiful basilica that is the reputed burial place of Saint James the Great, one of Christ's apostles.

Along the way we walked up and down hills, along country trails, smelling cow manure and hearing roosters crowing. We walked through towns, modern and medieval with oh-so-narrow cobblestone streets, and along beaches. We walked on hot, clear, blue-sky days and in pouring rain (but at least it was warm)! We stopped at museums and cathedrals and castles along the way, to marvel at the architecture and artwork.



We stayed in hostels, *albergues* (pronounced al BEAR gays) and Airbnbs in the larger cities. We even stayed in a convent and in a monastery! Sometimes there were up to 40 people in one big room, other times Judy and I shared a room with our own bathroom. Such luxury!!! How much did it cost? Between 8 and 30 Euros a night, the more expensive might include dinner and/or breakfast.



(For simplicity's sake, figure 1 E equals \$1.) Staying in the big cities is more expensive, but with a bit of savvy shopping, it is still quite reasonable... One picks up a pilgrim passport at the beginning of a pilgrimage, and has it stamped all along the way to Santiago, resulting in great *peregrino* discounts for lodging and eating. (And yes, the food is WONDERFUL.)

What about the language? Our leader spoke fluent Spanish,

which made it easier in many ways. Regardless of that advantage, the Spanish people were extremely kind, going out of their way to help us if we were lost or had other questions. We felt

totally safe, and were wished "Buen Camino!" countless times by old and young alike.

If you don't speak Spanish, you can download Google Translate to your cell phone, which will

allow you to read a menu or ask a simple question, etc.

Worried about carrying a backpack? The Spanish postal system (Correos) will expedite it to your next destination for the entire duration of your trip for about 45 Euros...

Yes, the trip was **STELLAR***** in all ways. making it hard to know where to start.

Grant Funding at Wor

Deanery Mission and Ministry Grant Funds 2023/2024:

In January, the Deanery granted \$10,550 for a Youth Mission Trip to Colombia in the summer of 2024. 16 Youth and 5 Chaperones will travel to Colombia for 17 days. Rev. Israel Portilla Gomez writes that the trip "is designed to help the St. Mary's and South-Central Deanery Youth grow and learn in their spiritual, emotional, social, and physical relationship with Christ, the Church, and youth from other cultures and languages, with whom we share the same faith as beloved children of God."

During 2023 Deanery grants were awarded to St. Christopher's, St. Augustine's, St. Bartholomew's and Christ Church for internet and technology equipment upgrades. St. David's received a grant for building a fence around their food production garden. In addition, the Deanery provided grant funds to help with education costs of three of our Deanery seminarians.

Mission and Ministry grants are available up to \$1500 for your next parish project. If you need a grant application, simply send an e-mail to <u>scdeanery@gmail.com</u>.
