



Katherine Hunt shared Church Redevelopment and Revisioning resources; and Judy Mullikin from St. Augustine's in Homer introduced walking the labyrinth.

On May 20, 2023, folks from around the Deanery gathered to help put in the fence posts for St. David's Garden. St. David's received



a Deanery Ministry grant to help expand their food production garden and to protect it from 4 legged critters like Moose and Rabbits. With a rented 2 (or 3 or 4) person augur, we dug holes and then placed the posts and added

concrete. There were jobs for everyone including cooking to feed hungry workers, measuring and marking, keeping an eye on the bubbles in the levels, auguring holes, chopping out roots, digging and widening the holes, pouring concrete and hauling buckets of water. By mid afternoon the project was done. It was a wonderful way to come together as a Dean-

ery and support each other's ministries. Stay tuned for future Deanery projects.


